

Can a single strand of BV cable be routed inside a cable tray

Yes, a single strand of BV cable can be routed inside a cable tray, provided it meets code requirements and installation best practices.

Code and Compliance Considerations

Single-conductor cables, including BV type, can be installed in cable trays if they comply with the National Electrical Code (NEC) Article 392 or equivalent international standards (IEC). The NEC specifies that single conductors larger than 1/0 AWG are generally permitted in trays, and smaller conductors may be allowed if they are properly supported and marked for tray use. The cable must also be rated for the intended voltage and environmental conditions.

Tray Fill and Ampacity

Even a single cable must be considered in terms of tray fill and ampacity derating. The cross-sectional area of the cable should not exceed the maximum allowable fill of the tray, which is typically 40-50% of the tray's internal area for single conductors. Proper spacing ensures heat dissipation and prevents insulation degradation. Ampacity derating may be minimal for a single cable, but it should still be verified against the cable's rated current capacity.
