

Can the grounding terminals of the distribution box be shared



Article Overview

Grounding terminals in a distribution box can be shared among multiple circuits, provided proper continuity and code compliance are maintained.

Main Panel vs Subpanel Considerations

In a main service panel, all grounding conductors can be connected to a common grounding terminal bar, which is bonded to the neutral and connected to a grounding electrode system (ground rod) as required by NEC 250.24(A) and 250.122 . This allows multiple circuits to share the same grounding terminal safely. In a subpanel, however, the grounding and neutral conductors must remain separate. The grounding terminal bar in a subpanel can be shared by all equipment grounding conductors, but it must not be bonded to the neutral . This ensures that fault currents return via the neutral only through the main panel, preventing dangerous current on grounding paths.

Equipment Grounding Conductors in Boxes

Within junction or outlet boxes, multiple equipment grounding conductors can be connected together and to the box if it is metal, using a grounding screw or listed grounding device . For nonmetallic boxes, the conductors should be spliced together to maintain continuity . The NEC allows a single grounding terminal to serve multiple conductors as long as the connection maintains a continuous path for fault current and does not compromise safety
