- Copper cables (Cat6, Cat6a, Cat7, Cat8) for shorter distances or rack-to-rack connections, supporting 10–40 Gbps .
- Ensure compliance with standards such as TIA-568, ISO/IEC 11801, and EN 50173 for consistent performance and interoperability
