

Distance between secondary distribution boxes



Article Overview

Secondary distribution boxes are typically spaced based on load density, voltage level, and accessibility, with common practice placing them near customer clusters or along secondary circuits for efficient service delivery.

General Guidelines

Secondary distribution boxes, also known as secondary distribution substations or low-voltage distribution boxes, are used to step down medium voltage (typically 6.6 kV or 11 kV) to low-voltage levels (up to 1 kV) for end-user consumption . The spacing of these boxes depends on several factors:

- **Load density:** In urban areas with high customer density, boxes are placed closer together to minimize voltage drop and ensure reliable service. In rural areas, spacing can be larger due to lower load density .
- **Voltage drop considerations:** To maintain voltage within acceptable limits, secondary boxes are positioned so that the distance from the transformer to the farthest customer does not exceed recommended limits, often a few hundred meters for low-voltage circuits .
- **Accessibility and safety:** Boxes must be installed in locations that are easily accessible for maintenance and comply with safety regulations, including clearances around the equipment .
