

Distance of cable tray portal frame support



Article Overview

Cable tray supports should generally be spaced 4 to 6 feet apart for horizontal runs, with adjustments based on cable weight, tray type, and installation environment.

Recommended Support Spacing

- **Horizontal Runs:** According to the National Electrical Code (NEC), cable trays must be supported at intervals specified by the manufacturer, but typically no more than 5 feet (1.5 meters) for standard horizontal runs. Ideal spacing is often 4 to 6 feet (1.2-1.8 meters) to prevent sagging and maintain structural integrity .
- **Vertical Runs:** For floor-mounted or vertical trays, a minimum clearance of 150 mm (6 inches) is recommended to allow for ventilation, maintenance, and future cable additions .
- **Ladder-Type Trays:** The rungs should not exceed 9 inches (230 mm) apart to ensure proper cable support .

Factors Affecting Spacing

- **Cable Type and Weight:** Heavier cables or bundles require closer support spacing. For example, MDPE-sheathed cables are stiffer and may allow slightly longer spans, whereas LSOH cables may need shorter intervals to limit sag .
- **Tray Material:** Steel, aluminum, or FRP trays have different load-bearing capacities, which influence the distance between portal frames .
- **Environmental Conditions:** External loads such as wind, seismic activity, or vibrati...
