

Fiber optic cable directly connected to the enterprise router

Fiber optic cables connect to enterprise routers via SFP/GBIC modules or through an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) for signal conversion.

Key Components

- **SFP/GBIC Modules:** Enterprise routers typically use Small Form-factor Pluggable (SFP) or Gigabit Interface Converter (GBIC) modules to interface with fiber optic cables. These modules convert optical signals into electrical signals the router can process and are hot-swappable for easy installation (Cisco documentation) .
- **Fiber Optic Cable:** Use the appropriate type of fiber—single-mode for long distances or multi-mode for shorter spans. Connectors like LC, SC, or SC/APC are common depending on the module and patch panel configuration .
- **Patch Panels:** In enterprise setups, fiber cables often terminate at a fiber patch panel, which organizes and routes connections to the router ports .

Step-by-Step Connection

- **Install SFP/GBIC Modules:** Insert the SFP or GBIC module into the router's designated WAN or LAN port. Ensure it is fully seated and compatible with the fiber type you are using .
- **Connect Fiber to Patch Panel:** Use SC to LC duplex fiber cables to link the router ports to the corresponding ports on the fiber patch panel. Each LAN port may connect to multiple patch panel ports depending on network design .
- **Link to ONT (if required):** For ISP-provided fiber, the optical signal may terminate at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT). Connect the fiber cable to the ONT's optical port...
