

Hazard Investigation of Cross-Road Fiber Optic Cables



Article Overview

Cross-road fiber optic cable installations require thorough hazard investigation, including risk assessment for physical, chemical, and optical hazards, along with strict adherence to safety protocols and PPE usage.

Risk Assessment and Documentation

Before any installation or maintenance, a risk assessment or Safe Work Method Statement (SWMS) should be completed and signed by all personnel involved within the last 12 months. This assessment identifies hazards specific to cross-road fiber optic work, including traffic exposure, splicing operations, and handling of bare fibers, and ensures that safe work practices are implemented for employees and subcontractors .

Key Hazards

1. Eye Safety: Never look directly into the end of a fiber cable unless confirmed dark using a fiber optic power meter. Visible light from tracers should be observed from an angle at least 6 inches away. Infrared light from OTDRs or amplifiers can harm the cornea or lens even if invisible to the eye, so proper eye protection is mandatory . 2. Bare Fiber and Fiber Shards: Broken fiber ends are extremely sharp and can penetrate skin. Fiber shards can contaminate clothing and surfaces, potentially causing ingestion hazards. Use disposable aprons, gloves, and dedicated containers for fiber scrap disposal. Avoid eating or drinking near the work area . 3. Chemical H...
