

How many sockets can a distribution box have

The number of sockets in a distribution box depends on the intended load, type of installation, and future expansion, typically ranging from a few circuits in residential setups to multiple high-capacity sockets in industrial environments.

Residential and Small Office Installations

For homes or small offices, distribution boxes usually contain enough circuits to handle individual appliances and lighting, with each circuit protected by its own breaker or fuse. A typical setup might include 6 to 12 sockets for network or low-current connections, such as RJ45 outlets for data distribution, allowing flexibility and future expansion . The exact number should be based on the total power demand of appliances, calculated using the 80% rule for safe continuous load .

Industrial and High-Capacity Installations

In industrial settings, distribution boxes often use industrial-grade sockets rated for higher currents (16A, 32A, 63A, or 125A) and voltages (110V, 220V, 380V), with IP44 or IP67 protection depending on environmental conditions . The number of sockets is determined by the equipment requirements, load distribution, and safety standards. Surface-mounted or flush-mounted sockets are used depending on accessibility and installation type . Modular designs allow adding more sockets as needed without overloading the box....
