Fiber Optic Couplers

Definition and Function: Fiber optic couplers are devices that connect multiple fiber ends, allowing light to be split, combined, or redistributed between fibers. They can be passive (no external power) or active (requiring power for signal processing) and are widely used in FTTH networks, data centers, fiber lasers, and sensor systems .

Types of Fiber Optic Couplers:

- **Splitters and Combiners:** Split one input into multiple outputs (Y-couplers for equal power, T-couplers for uneven power) or combine multiple inputs into one output .
 - **X-Couplers, Star, and Tree Couplers:** Designed for complex network topologies with multiple input/output ports .
 - **Fused Biconical Taper (FBT) Couplers:** Fibers are fused and tapered to allow controlled light transfer .
 - **Planar Lightwave Circuit (PLC) Splitters:** Use waveguide circuits on silica or polymer substrates for precise splitting .
 - **Dichroic Couplers:** Wavelength-sensitive devices for combining or separating light at different wavelengths .
- Key Selection Criteria:**
- **Fiber Type:** Single-mode for long-distance, multimode for shorter distances; multimode can be step-index or graded-index .
 - **Number of Ports:** Determines the splitting or combining configuration (e.g., 1×2, 1...
