A Layer 3 switch serves as the high-speed backbone of a network, providing routing, aggregation, and ultra-low latency connectivity between distribution layers.

Role of a Layer 3 Core Switch

A Layer 3 switch at the core layer functions as the central backbone of an enterprise or campus network, interconnecting distribution switches and enabling high-speed routing between VLANs, subnets, and security zones. Unlike access or distribution switches, core switches are optimized for high throughput, low latency, and reliability, ensuring that large volumes of traffic move efficiently across the network. They handle only forwarding and routing between mid-level devices, avoiding complex policy checks that could slow traffic.

Key Features

- **High Performance:** Supports port speeds from 10G to 400G+, with large buffers and wire-speed forwarding to handle bursty traffic.
- **Routing Capabilities:** Performs IP routing between VLANs and subnets using advanced protocols, enabling Layer 3 functionality.
- **Redundancy and Fault Tolerance:** Dual power supplies, hot-swappable modules, and support for HSRP/VRRP ensure continuous operation even during failures.
- **Scalability:** Modular or stackable designs allow the network to grow without major overhauls.
- **Minimal Policy Processing:** Core switches focus on high-speed forwarding rather than enforcing access control or QoS policies, which are handled at the distribution...
