

Must low-voltage cables be run through conduits when exiting cable trays

TC-ER-rated cables can be installed in exposed runs outside the cable tray, up to 6 feet between the cable tray and connected equipment, and without conduit—provided that the cable is secured and protected from mechanical damage, per code.
