How It Works

The bare end of the pigtail is fusion or mechanically spliced to the corresponding fiber in the main cable, creating a permanent, low-loss connection. The connectorized end of the pigtail then plugs into an ODF, patch panel, or active equipment, allowing easy access and flexible network management.
