- **Data Aggregation:** Collects and routes traffic from distribution and access layers to maintain smooth communication .
- **High Performance:** Optimized for ultra-fast packet forwarding and minimal latency, often supporting port speeds from 10G to 400G+ .
- **Redundancy and Fault Tolerance:** Many core switches include dual power supplies, hot-swappable modules, and link aggregation to ensure continuous operation .
- **Scalability:** Modular or stackable designs allow networks to grow without major overhauls .
- **Security and Management:** Advanced features like ACLs, 802.1X support, and centralized management help protect and control network traffic
