

What is the spacing between cable tray partitions



Article Overview

The recommended spacing between cable tray partitions is generally at least 150 mm vertically and 0.6 meters horizontally, with adjustments for power and signal separation or shielding.

Vertical Spacing

For floor-mounted or stacked cable trays, the minimum vertical clearance between trays should be 150 millimeters (6 inches). This ensures sufficient room for maintenance, future cable additions, ventilation, and heat dissipation, while preventing cable interference and maintaining structural integrity . When trays are stacked, the same minimum clearance applies between the upper and lower trays to allow for expansion and rearrangement of cables .

Horizontal Spacing

For parallel cable trays at the same height, the horizontal spacing should generally be no less than 0.6 meters (approximately 2 feet). This distance provides adequate airflow, reduces the risk of cables touching, and allows easy access for inspection and maintenance . When separating power and signal/control trays, a minimum horizontal or vertical distance of 0.5 to 0.6 meters (20-24 inches) is recommended to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI) and maintain signal integrity . If the trays are shielded, this spacing can be reduced to less than 0.3 meters (12 inches), as shielding helps contain EMI
