

What to do if the telecommunications fiber optic cable is removed



Article Overview

To safely remove a fiber optic cable, power down the equipment, identify the connector type, and carefully disengage the cable while avoiding direct eye exposure to the fiber end.

Safety Precautions

Fiber optic cables transmit data as light through extremely thin glass or plastic strands, often using invisible infrared light that can damage your eyes if viewed directly. Always assume the fiber is active and never look into the cable end or port. Before handling, power down the equipment by unplugging the modem, Optical Network Terminal (ONT), or fiber gateway to ensure the fiber port is inactive and to protect internal electronics. Keep the work area clean and free of dust to prevent contamination of the fiber tip .

Identify Connector Type

Different connectors require different removal techniques. Common types include:

- SC and SC/APC: Rectangular body with push/pull latching
 - LC: Compact, uses a lift-and-pull release mechanism
 - ST: Twist-and-lock bayonet mount style
- Consult your equipment documentation to confirm the connector type before attempting removal, as using the wrong technique can damage the cable or port
